Speak Up, Speak Out Film Programme

A special programme of short films based around the theme of Speak Up, Speak Out, featuring:

- Coexist tells the emotional stories of women who survived the Rwandan genocide in 1994. They continue to cope with the loss of their families as the killers who created this trauma return from jail back to the villages where they once lived. Faced with these perpetrators on a daily basis, the victims must decide whether they can forgive. In this remarkable documentary film, the survivors share their inner most feelings on confronting the killers, and speak up, speak out on their life in post-genocide Rwanda today. - The Battle of Cable Street which tells the story of the grandfather of Yoav Segal, the film's director, who helped organise the Battle of Cable Street against Mosley's British Union of Fascists in London's East End in 1936. A mixture of animation and HD live action.
- *Pigeon*, which is set during World War II and is based on a true story, and recounts a rare and startling act of charity. Sumptuously shot and emotionally affecting, Anthony Greens short drama features Academy Award nominee Michael Lerner, and Canadian treasure Wendy Crewson.
